The sailing committee reports that safety documentation is being updated and all is hand for a successful season. Bendigo Bank, together with member donations in lieu of presentation night trophies, will fund acquisition of two O'pen BICs for sailing school.

By the time you read this the building contract will be complete. On time and on budget. A great credit to Cameron Harvey who has managed the project on behalf of the club and to our builder Tuecon. Thanks also to members Dennis Middleton and Bruce Harrison who have laboured over all the electrical work. There are still some dollars to find, so please show generosity and forbearance as the hardworking capital raising committee reach for the final goal. Once the contract is done, Amanda and Grahame will embark on a program of fitting out the storerooms, rehanging honour boards and photos, installing blinds and other miscellaneous works that were not part of the building contract. Let them know if you can help.

Division 4 Report

The busy schedule of winter regattas continued for travelling Somers YC Laser sailors over the last couple of months.

Spring Sail regatta at Royal Geelong YC took place on the 24th/25th September. This was a fairly windy regatta 15-20 knots with 4 races on each day. Some of the races were a little short (11 mins), some start lines you couldn't sail along on starboard, and some of the scoring a bit wayward. Lucy in her new Radial 'Diamonds' finished 5th overall and Simon 6th out of 23 Lasers (4.7/Radial/Standard).

Mid October saw the Sail Sandy regatta at Sandringham YC. 8 races over 2 sunny days saw Lucy finishing 8th overall (out of 20 Lasers (4.7/Radial/Standard). Day 1 was challenging until the sea breeze filled in whereas the Sunday was breezy.

One of the biggest regattas this time of year is Sail Country at Albury Wodonga YC $(3^{rd}/4^{th} \text{ Nov.})$ which sold out

(200 boats) within a couple of days back in August and this year featured the Victorian Laser Inland Championships. Lucy Ede (Radial) and Simon and Harrison Ede (Standard) entered, and Nick went off to crew a Fireball. Races were in three separate fleets consisting of 13 4.7s, 27 Laser Radials and 12 Standard rigs. Day 1 consisted of shifty gusty conditions (50 degree shifts upwind!) for 4 races in variable wind strengths making it testing for everyone. Only 2 races were possible on day 2 with some early more consistent wind which then dropped off to nothing. Lucy finished 10th overall in the Radials and Harrison 7th overall in the Standards which was hampered by gear failure in one race. At the front of the Standard fleet there was a three-way tie on 12 points between three boats! Countback to three races eventually separated the tie resulting in a sailor from NSW winning and Simon coming second!

Membership Renewal

Please do not leave this until the day before Christmas!

Registration this season has been complicated by the poor data transferred to the new system, so please be patient and try to use it noting the information in the instruction sheet and the information below.

By now members should have received their renewal information in the mail.

It would have been sent to the postal address nominated previously entered into our database.

If you have nominated a Somers address, please check with the post office.

Many members have successfully renewed on line using the new system.

There are others who have been experiencing trouble, generally the issues noted below.

<u>Please try and follow the instructions, noting the two</u> items below:

Incorrect birthdate not giving access

If you are locked out or rejected, your birthdate could be incorrect in the system.

Log in to My Sailor and change your birth details there. https://www.sailing.org.au/login

If you can't remember your user name and password, select "Forgot Log in Details" and you will be sent an email with the correct log in details. You can then change your birthdate.

This one below is causing the most trouble.

Not renewing all members of the couple, family and/or children.

When you have entered all details of Adult1, there is a line at the bottom of the page

NEXT STEP – After adding me: with a drop down menu giving three options.

- 1.To view the member (you)
- 2.Back to member listing.
- 3.To add another member (adult 2, or child)

Use this option to add other members. It should take you back so you can add in Adult 2, and repeat the process to include Children

Again, this year's renewal and the accuracy of completing the membership details for all members of the couple or family is very important. Be sure to complete all your contact details, boat details, including kayaks where applicable. If you have any difficulties with this, please call Richard Fakhry on 0418 576 622.

Kayak Registration and Storage.

There are a number of kayaks, windsurfers and paddle boards in the yard that have not been registered

If you do require storage please register your kayak as a boat under the Class as kayak and add colour or other identifying feature.

There is no registration fee applicable, simply the storage fee of \$60 for each craft.

The racks are becoming quite crowded, and any kayak unpaid for this season will be removed. We are currently investigating the best form of uniform identification.


